Course Description: This course is an introduction to calculus and analytic geometry including limits, continuity of functions, definition of differentiation, derivation of formulas, applications, anti-differentiation and the fundamental theorem of calculus. To complement classroom instruction, students will be required to problem solve using the computer algebra system, Maple.

Prerequisites: To be successful in this course, a student should have a strong background in algebra and some familiarity with trigonometry. Ordinarily this means high school trigonometry and advanced algebra.

Course Objectives: This course is designed to introduce science and engineering students to the fundamentals of multivariable calculus. Topics covered include:
vectors & geometry of space
vector valued functions
partial derivatives
multiple integrals
vector calculus.

Course Textbook: *Calculus: Early Transcendentals, 9th ed.* by J. Stewart, D. Clegg, and S. Watson. An e-textbook is included with WebAssign access, which is required for the course (see below).

REQUIRED MATERIALS:

- (1) Blackboard (BB): <u>https://elearning.villanova.edu/</u> All class materials will be posted to Blackboard under the COURSE CONTENT tab on the left. <u>Students are expected to check BlackBoard for weekly</u> <u>reminders, due dates, course notes, and worksheets, all of which will be posted under the current</u> <u>week's module.</u>
- (2) WebAssign: Weekly homework assignments are to be completed via WebAssign, an online supplement to our textbook. Purchase options (single or multi-semester) and WebAssign registration instructions can be found on the WEEK 1 Module in BlackBoard under COURSE CONTENT.

(3) Maple (2023 version): We will use Maple, a mathematical computing program, in class as well as for some assignments. Installation instructions can be found on the WEEK 1 Module in BB under COURSE CONTENT.

SUGGESTED MATERIALS:

Scientific Calculator: You may use one during class, exams, and quizzes. <u>GRAPHING</u> <u>CALCULATORS ARE PROHIBITED DURING QUIZZES AND EXAMS</u>. The most advanced calculator that can be used during exams should align with the TI-30X family (<u>VU Bookstore</u> <u>scientific calculator</u>).

HOMEWORK:

- There will be weekly WebAssign assignments (2-3 sets total), due Mondays, 11:59 PM.
- There will be 3 Maple Assignments in total. They are to be completed with your classwork groups in PDF format via BlackBoard.

EXTENSIONS, MAKE-UPS, & EXTRA CREDIT POLICY:

- Extensions for assignments will **always** be granted (WebAssign or Maple). However, **7% will** be deducted for each additional day an assignment is late.
- **Missing quizzes/exams:** The instructor must be notified <u>at least 24 hours in advance VIA EMAIL</u> if you are going to miss a quiz/exam, and a valid excuse, preferably with written documentation (e.g., doctor's note) must be provided.

Whether or not a make-up will be granted is at the instructor's discretion. Travel plans do not constitute an acceptable reason to reschedule an exam or quiz. Please plan accordingly during finals and semester breaks.

• Extra credit assignments <u>WILL NOT</u> be granted under any circumstances.

CLASSWORK:

A worksheet will be posted every week on Blackboard and the course website. Most Thursdays will be dedicated to working on worksheet problems in your classwork groups. Each of you will be a member of a group of 4-5 students and will be expected to post a solution to a worksheet problem on the board. Classwork will be graded based on attendance and participation.

QUIZZES:

There will be a quiz nearly every Tuesday. Quizzes will be completed with your classwork group members. Each quiz will cover the previous week's material. The lowest quiz grade is dropped.
